Happy October everyone! With the arrival of autumn, we hope to have seen the last of the 100° days. October also heralds the annual Neighbor Night Out (now called Neighbors Together) on October 4th. So, get out and renew friendships and make new ones!

This year's swim season broke all known records with 16,743 visits! That doesn't count swim team and water aerobics. CellBadge continues to grow with over 1,900 families and 6,000 members registered.

Thank you again to the 99% of our homeowners who have taken care of their 2022 annual assessment. So, with careful management of our resources we hope to hold the 2023 annual assessment to \$250 for the sixth straight year! As in the past you will receive your 2023 statement in December, which is due January 1st. The January annual meeting notice and proxy will also be in that mailing. Thanks to Chief McManus and Councilwoman Havrda for doing a neighborhood walk on August 26th to listen to homeowner concerns. They appreciated our efforts to reduce crime by building a fence on Kimber St. to stop vagrant traffic coming into our neighborhood from the undeveloped area along Helotes Creek and cutting a fire break in that same area. We felt it prudent to clear that area as the fire department has seen an increase in the number of fire and overdose calls to the undeveloped areas along Loop 1604.

Thanks also to Victor Landa of the Councilwoman's staff for attending our September 21st Board meeting to answer homeowner questions. As there were several questions about speed bumps, we have included in this newsletter the city's *Neighborhood Traffic Calming Request Application*.

It was a productive and informative morning, and we are very thankful for his visit and interest in our community.









Back-to-School Outdoor Movie Night

SAWS REMAINS IN STAGE 2 WITH STRICTER ENFORCEMENT

Additional patrols authorized for watering rules violators

San Antonio Water System customers have been in Stage 2 watering rules since April, and despite differing stages from the Edwards Aquifer Authority, there are no foreseeable outdoor watering changes for SAWS customers.


The utility continues to educate and remind customers about Stage 2 rules – and those who don't comply with the rules can receive a citation with municipal fines costing about \$150 for first-time offenses. So far this year, increased patrolling around the clock has resulted in more than 1,200 citations being issued.

"We have been patrolling neighborhoods, including gated communities, in an effort to enforce compliance with Stage 2," said Karen Guz, SAWS Director of Conservation. "We're past the point of issuing warnings; anyone caught wasting water or breaking Stage 2 watering rules will receive a citation."

MONARCH BUTTERFLY FESTIVAL TAKES FLIGHT

Just in time for migrating monarchs to move through Texas and on to Mexico, the festival kicks off Saturday, October 8th at Brackenridge Park.

Visitors can expect monarch tagging demos, waggle dancing, educational booths, and a unique People for Pollinators procession.



There will also be a Forever Journey altar, where you can honor loved ones who have died by tagging butterflies in their memory.

Since starting the Forever Journey initiative in 2020, five tagged butterflies have been recovered on the forest floor in Mexico — usually just in time for Día de Los Muertos in early November.

THE FORD HOLIDAY RIVER PARADE AND LIGHTING CEREMONY

On November 25th, the River Walk is transformed into a parade of decorative floats and bright lights to kick off the holiday season.



The 2022 Ford Holiday River Parade is a San Antonio tradition that offers a spectacular one-hour parade along the San Antonio River Walk. This themed parade is a San Antonio tradition that kicks off the lighting of the River Walk and the holiday season.

This parade features 28 illuminated floats, and 100,000 lights (2,250 strands) are lit to kick off the parade. The lights remain on the trees and are turned on from

sundown to sunrise everyday till shortly after New Year's Day.

Always held the day after Thanksgiving, 2022 Holiday River Parade ticket prices range from \$15-\$40 and are sold on-line beginning in early July. Free seating areas are on the parade route (bring your own chair). The majority of River Walk restaurants offer dinner packages.

Boundary limits may change at the discretion of the Transportation & Capital Improvements (TCI). Traffic studies will be conducted only within the boundaries indicated.
