Your Board approved the 2024 budget confirming that the Annual Assessment will remain at \$250 for the seventh year. In addition to the routine maintenance of our buildings, parks, pools, and playgrounds, this year Dusty also managed the repair of the tennis court lights at Dover Ridge, the pool lights at both pools, as well as several water leaks throughout and sewer lines at the Weybridge Pool.

We also continue to work with various city agencies to keep us safe and the streets maintained. Our security team updated their incident reporting system to provide higher quality photos and videos. We hope to see even more of a police presence as SAPD increases staffing in the coming year. San Antonio is seeing an increase in car break-ins so be sure to lock your vehicles and remove any valuables. We have a homeowner video showing an attempted break-in and them fleeing the scene as our security approaches. The yellow flashing lights scare bad guys away. The holidays mean more deliveries and porch pirates. Please help your neighbors by being vigilant and offering to secure delivered packages.

Our finances remain strong as your Board and Management Company (Patriot) continue to find ways to keep a lid on costs and maximize revenue through better rates of interest.

PORCH PIRATES

6 Steps to Take if Your Package is Stolen

STEP 1: TRACK THE PACKAGE

If you suspect your package was stolen, the first thing you should do is check your purchase confirmation email for tracking information. The shipping status will show you where your package was last registered or the date it was delivered.

CRIMINAL ILLEGAL

STEP 2: CHECK THAT A NEIGHBOR DOESN'T HAVE IT

If you verified the item was delivered, check with your neighbors. Maybe the kind lady next door saw your package and took it inside in order to prevent it from getting stolen or rained on.

STEP 3: CONTACT THE SELLER OR RETAILER

If it appears that your package was stolen, contact the seller or retailer that sold you the item. Retailers have different policies and processes for handling stolen items, but you are usually entitled to a refund or a replacement.

STEP 4: FILE A CLAIM WITH THE SHIPPING COMPANY

Sometimes retailers try to shift responsibility to the shipping company or require you to file a complaint and wait a certain number of days to find out for certain whether your package will not be delivered. If you encounter this scenario, you might want to file a claim with the shipping company as well.

STEP 5: CHECK CREDIT CARDS FOR PURCHASE PROTECTION


Many credit cards offer purchase protection that will reimburse you for stolen items, provided the item was purchased entirely with that credit card, and the card issuer is alerted within a specified timeframe.

STEP 6: CLAIM HIGH-VALUE ITEMS WITH HOMEOWNERS INSURANCE

Most homeowners/renters insurance policies cover stolen packages. Unfortunately, it is helpful only for purchases whose value is well above your deductible, and a typical homeowner's insurance deductible runs from \$500 to \$2,000 dollars.

NWC Association holds board member elections annually. Have you ever considered getting involved?

What is the Board of Directors?

The Board of Directors consists of elected, volunteer Northwest Crossing homeowners. They are not paid for their time, nor do they receive discounts on their annual assessments. Positions vary by term length as follows:

•Five, 3-year term positions

•Two, 1-year term positions

The elected Board collectively determines which members will fill specific officer positions - President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer, and three positions for Member at Large. There is no limit to the number of times a resident can be re-elected to the Board.

What is a proxy form?

The proxy form is part of the Annual Homeowners Meeting notice and is mailed with the annual statement to each homeowner in December. By completing the form:

- 1. You acknowledge the scheduled Annual Homeowners Meeting even if you cannot attend.
- 2. You give the Association permission to count your proxy for the purposes of obtaining a quorum.

How does one get elected to the Board?

Elections for Board positions are held at the NWC Annual Homeowners Meeting in January. NWC homeowners in good standing are eligible to be nominated for Board positions. Votes are cast and tallied at the Annual Homeowners Meeting. Homeowners interested in being nominated to serve on the Board may contact the On-site Office. They may also want to contact neighbors to introduce themselves, encourage attendance at the Annual Homeowners Meeting, and/or provide them with proxy forms. Nominations may also be made at the Annual Homeowners Meeting. Intention to nominate does not have to be expressed ahead of time.

Does the proxy form give away my vote?

In addition to helping the Association acquire a quorum, the proxy also gives homeowners the option to transfer their votes for any elections or other decisions that require a vote to:

- another NWC homeowner
- an NWC Board member
- or to the existing Board of Directors as a group.

If the space indicated for vote transfer is left blank, the homeowner's vote will not be transferred; the proxy will be used for the purpose of acquiring a quorum only. Proxy forms may be requested from the On-site Office. For the proxy form to be counted, completed proxy forms must be received by the Association by date specified on the form.
